

### A Note from PD

The Local 48 PD Committee would like to offer sponsorship to teachers for personal professional development in the following two formats. Applications for funding may be submitted to PD Co-Chairs Veronica Doleman and Deborah Nicholson.

#### **Book Studies**

Groups of teachers who would like to participate in a book study may apply to the PD committee for funds to purchase books for participants. Books could be purchased through a variety of sources, the Barnett House Library being one. The book would need to be related to the participant's professional growth and focus on curriculum, teaching practice, or student wellness. Along with the book requests, a group would be asked to submit a SMART goal and timeline. Groups would also be asked to consider the possibility of sharing their findings at an ATA monthly council meeting.

# Collaborative Discussion Groups

The PD Committee would like to facilitate groups of teachers to get together after school hours to share resources and best teaching practices, focusing on individual professional growth. The committee will cover the cost of light snacks and refreshments for participants. Groups would not need to meet at a school; the collaboration could take place wherever the group members chose. Groups are asked to submit a proposal to the PD Committee explaining the focus of their discussion. For example, Grade 4 teachers, Music K-6, DI, or Project Based Learning. Be creative, think cross-districts, think outside the box. After PD committee approval and their first meeting, a group would submit a participant list and receipt with the cost being limited to \$125 per group.

## **Convention Attendance Guidelines**

All teachers have a legal as well as a professional obligation to attend the annual teachers' convention to which they have been assigned as stated in the School Act.

A charge of unprofessional conduct under Association discipline bylaws may be lodged against a teacher who fails to attend the teachers' convention. School boards also have the right to deduct pay from teachers absent from a convention without authorization or reason and, in fact, have done so.

Employers, school staff, Association subgroups and individual teachers shall not organize other school or district activities that conflict with annual teachers' conventions. Any such other activities that are scheduled may be contrary to the School Act.

Notwithstanding teacher rights under collective agreements, teachers are expected to consider convention dates as a professional priority in planning for the school year and as a link to their Teacher **Prof**essional Growth Plans.
